

Williamson County Health Plan Information

1095-C Form

Employers with 50+ full time employees are required to report information to the IRS reporting whether or not they offered full time employees affordable health care coverage and information about that coverage. Taxpayers who do not have health insurance coverage must pay a penalty when they file their tax returns.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

Form 1095-C has being provided to you as proof of the health coverage that Williamson County offers you and your dependents. It contains information about who provides the health insurance, as well as other information about the health coverage that was offered to you. It also lists the lowest monthly premium that you could have elected for the self-only health benefits offered to you.

You can use Form 1095-C to help you report your insurance coverage when filing your tax return for 2018. Only one form is provided from Williamson County for all the individuals listed on your policy; you may need to provide copies to your spouse or dependents, as necessary.

You do not need your 1095-C form when you file your 2018 tax return. Once the 1095-C form is received, it should be kept with tax records for 2018. Williamson County Governemnt and Board of Education employees have been mailed their 1095-C for 2018. If you did not receive it or need a copy contact the Williamson County Benefits Department.
